Keynote Address: Harnessing Your Power to Create Change

Derreck Kayongo, Former Refugee Turned Global Human Rights Activist and Former CEO Of The National Center For Civil And Human Rights



As Founder of the Global Soap Project, Kayongo has built a multi-million dollar venture which takes recycled soap and distributes it through global health programs to people who lack access to it around the world. He breaks down the key factors that have led to his personal success; (S.E.L.F.) Service, Education, Leadership and Faith and shares his account of life as a Ugandan refugee and the turning point which lead him to a brilliant transformation as a social entrepreneur. He calls upon audiences to stop complaining and to start taking responsibility, to consistently seek opportunities to improve, and most importantly, to maintain faith in yourself and your team to create an environment where everyone is empowered to thrive. He brings you on an emotional journey –there will be tears of joy; most of the time, laughter. But every time, the story is real.

His passion for helping others and commitment to innovative thinking previously earned him the role of CEO of the National Center for Civil and Human Rights. Most recently Derreck has joined the board of trustees for Helen Keller International, an organization committed to improving the sight of vulnerable populations around the world.

From Ugandan refugee to successful entrepreneur and renowned human rights activist, Derreck inspires audiences to dream big as he shares his vision for harnessing the power of observation to identify issues and solve challenges in any community or organization.

You can open numerous books and observe two dozen ways to stand up a PMO. And reviewing PMO maturity model tools will lead you to believe that a more "mature" PMO is better. However, none of these books or tools know your business or your culture, and there is only one PMO that is right for you—and only you can determine what that is! Your first assignment when determining that you need a PMO is to seek out the answer to a simple question: What problem are we trying to solve? If you can answer that, you have two more questions that must be answered before you can lay out a plan: 1) How did we find ourselves in this situation (indicates obstacles you will face)? and 2) How much change can our culture accept (indicates speed of change)? Answering these three basic questions will help you lay out a strategy for the kind of PMO you want to have—and the steps it will take to get you there.
